Please note the additional information below in regards to the Principal Review Process for Mrs Melissa Marquis:

The Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia has endorsed a process of performance review for Principals. Mrs Melissa Marquis is one of a number of Principals in Catholic schools to be reviewed this year.

This Principal Review Process relates only to the Principal's Duties and Responsibilities (as enunciated in the Principal's Contract of Employment) and is not a School Review or Evaluation.

The aims of the Principal Review Process are:

- Accountability to the Employer
- Renewal of Contract and
- Professional Development

The process will involve the following members of the school community: selected Staff; the School Board; the Parents & Friends Executive; and the Parish Priest.

This review will be conducted by means of written evaluation, followed by interviews with a review panel, which will take place during Term Two.

## SCIENTIST IN SCHOOL'S PROGRAM – MISS ALLISON HENSS

As part of the Scientists in Schools Program Miss Allison Henss joined the Year 5/6 Science Class for the first time on Wednesday 8 March. She has worked for many years as a Marine Biologist. Miss Henss shared some of the highlights of her career with the students. Some of these have included her experiences working with for an environmental impact study over a two year period, investigating the impact to marine life if a port was built at Oakajee, filming for National Geographic magazine, working for the Fisheries Department, and her experiences scuba diving at the Abrolhos Islands. Firstly, students viewed a small film clip of life in the ocean surrounding the Abrolhos Islands. They then engaged and were challenged by a quiz identifying twenty specimens found in the ocean. This provided a stimulating conversation as to what it might be and whether it was part of the plant or animal life of the ocean. Lastly, students discussed the animal kingdom, phylums. We look forward to Miss Henss returning next term to continue her involvement with the Year 5/6 Class.



St Mary's School would like to thank you for your support and wish you all the best with your football tipping in the 2017 season. The monies raised will assist the school in purchasing teacher and student resources, Sport and IT. The Rules and Regulations of the competition are listed below.


### Prizes

1. A weekly prize of \$50 will be awarded to the player who selects the most winning teams in each weekly AFL round and has the closest winning margin in the nominated game i.e. **the first game played in each round**. In case of disputes, see Point 7 in the Rules.
2. The number of correct winning teams and tally of closest winning margins selected throughout the season, **not including the finals**, by each player will be accumulated. The player with the highest number of winning teams will win \$800. The player who selects the second highest number of winning teams at the end of the home and away AFL season will win \$300. The player who selects the third highest number of winning teams at the end of the home and away AFL season will win \$100. In the event of multiple first place winners, first and second place will be culminated and divided between the first place winners and second place will be awarded \$100.
3. The cost per registration is \$50. If payment has not been received by **23/03/2017 you will be deleted from the competition**.

### Rules

- Each tipper must submit their tip before the bounce down of each game. Should a tipper not have access to the internet or experience an issue with the website, tips can be forwarded to the administrator at [stmarysfootytipping@hotmail.com](mailto:stmarysfootytipping@hotmail.com) no later than the start of the round. It is recommended in the **Settings>My Preferences section of the St Marys Footy Tipping competition YES is selected to 'Allow the administrator to edit/enter my tips'**, to ensure you are covered should this instance occur.
- Tippers who do not enter tips for an entire round will be allocated the default score. The default score is the lowest score minus 1. Tippers allocated the default score will never score below 0.
- **Tippers who are not confident with online submission have the opportunity to be adopted by a St Mary's School community member.** Tips must be provided to your adoptive tipper before 12.00pm of the first day of each round.
- **The Weekly Prize:** The player who has selected the highest number of winning teams will win the weekly prize of \$50. If two or more players have selected the same number of correct winning teams, the player closest to the winning margin will determine the winner. If any of these players have the same winning margin, the weekly prize of \$50 will be divided evenly.
- The weekly winning players will be notified by email or telephone, and will receive a cash/cheque for the amount of their prize. This can be picked up from St Mary's School Office.
- The weekly winner will be advertised in the school's fortnightly newsletter and on the school's website <http://smsn.wa.edu.au>
- All disputes may be forwarded in writing to St Mary's School PO Box 138, Northampton WA 6535. The Football Tipping Committee will discuss the issue and make a decision. The players will be notified of their decision. **THE FOOTBALL TIPPING COMMITTEE'S DECISION WILL BE FINAL AND NO FURTHER CORRESPONDENCE WILL BE ENTERED IN TO.** Any disputes **MUST** be submitted within seven days of results of the disputed round being published.

The first AFL bounce down is on 24 March this year. While we are getting a warm up for the AFL footy season watching the ladies play, it is a good time to start getting some tippers signed up for our 2017 competition!

Footy Tipping raised \$2 837.50 towards P&F camp funds in 2016. We were down on numbers last year, which we hope to recuperate this year.

The 2017 tipping will be run completely online at the cost of \$50. While we did have some tippers hesitant to use the technology at the start of last season, many did join midway throughout the year and found it was not as daunting as first thought.

There is still an expectation some people will not be confident with the online tipping process. In an effort not to exclude anyone, the P&F are hoping to find some school community members to 'adopt a tipper' as we make the full transition into online tipping. This will entail loading their adoptive tippers tips online on their behalf, which would need to be submitted before 12.00pm on the first day of the round.

We currently have thirty one families and the students would benefit greatly if each family could endeavour to sell five booklets. This would mean we would have 155 participants equalling \$5 400 funds raised, which would be amazing. The higher numbers previously have lead into an overflow of camp funds and straight into class resources.

Being online, we are not restricted by geography. Our furthest competitor was in Chile last year! As mentioned at the AGM, Footy Tipping is one of our most profitable and least labour intensive fundraisers, so if you achieve your 5 tippers it will go a long way to P & F fundraising (and may save you from having to contribute your time to another fundraiser).

Each classroom as a group, will be competing this year, which should make for some fun!

Families, if you could fill in the details of each competitor and return it to the school as soon as possible, along with the consideration of being an adoptive tipper, it would be greatly appreciated.

Please advise if a tipper is not confident tipping online and would like to be adopted. All adopted tippers will receive a booklet following registration.




