Communio Week 2023 - 'Looking out for others'



Creating environments where children feel safe, are engaged and can flourish

Christ-centred, child-focused

Designed to support schools in maintaining engaging, supportive and safe environments

All children have the right to a good education. Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) schools and early years learning and care centres are Christ-centred, and child-focused learning communities that support each child to develop to their full God-given potential. Key to this is ensuring the learning environment is engaging, safe and supportive.

The framework outlines the policies, practices and behaviours found in our schools that underpin a culture prioritising the best interests of children and young people.

Good relationships are vital if Catholic schools are to achieve their aims. Both parents and the school need to work at building constructive relationships.¹

All members of our Catholic school community share the responsibility for this healthy culture. Your school relies on strong partnerships with you – as parents and carers – to provide your child with the best possible learning and development opportunities. Working together, we can ensure all children and young people flourish in a safe, healthy environment.

The framework is based upon the following key practices:

Situational prevention

Is constantly evaluating our total environment to minimise opportunities of risk and bring the hidden into the open. The focus is on creating safer environments.

These include elements within our schools: including physical and online environments, staffing, governance, behaviours and culture with an aim to eliminate or mitigate situations that present risk for children and young people.

Extended Guardianship

When our leaders, staff and wider school community share a collective responsibility to actively support an environment that is engaging, supportive and safe.

It is about having respectful conversations regarding the behaviours we see and how they reflect our Code of Conduct for staff, parents and students to ensure we create a culture where our students are heard, are safe and can thrive.

Healthy Respectful Relationships

Pope Francis says as an essential requirement of love is "every human being is bound to live agreeably with those around him." Our role as teachers, parents and guardians is to model healthy respectful relationships for our students & children so they will be equipped with the knowledge to understand how they should be treated.

The presence of healthy respectful relationships is by their very nature protective and allow children to flourish.








LOOK HOW MUCH WE'VE






