Mid-Year Reports

Reports in Years PP-6 measure student progress using an A-E grading scale, with a C grade indicating that students are meeting the 'at target' point for their respective year level in each of the learning areas.

To ensure that parents and carers are fully informed prior to these reports being sent home, teachers will be arranging meetings with parents and carers of students who have not reached this desired target in the English and Mathematics learning areas. Mid-Year Reports will be sent home on **Thursday 29 June**. If you have any concerns or queries regarding your child's School Report, please arrange a mutually convenient time to meet with your child's classroom teacher.



Notwithstanding the many grants that were implemented on the upgrading of the storm water control, the verandah decking and balustrade which are the external visual repairs. 
