
In Kindy/Preprimary, during Health, we have been learning about 'Safety on Wheels' .We learnt the A,B,C

We also learnt that we need to wear an Australian Standard Approved helmet that correctly fits our head. (Although we practiced with our hats under the helmet as we were sharing helmets).








The wonderful Mrs Box is shaving her head to raise money for the Leukaemia Foundation!


