# **Dear Parents and Community Members,**

Welcome to the conclusion of Week Eight and the final two week stretch to the end of the term. Our students are maintaining their dedication to improving their learning and our teachers and support staff are working really hard to support them. Although we are all feeling a bit weary, we will 'soldier on' to ensure your child/ren will be provided with a school experience of challenge, faith, respect and teamwork.

One of the high impact teaching and learning practices our teachers, and support staff, implement into their day-to-day duties, is a data informed approach. Using a variety of sources, teaches triangulate data to implement point in time learning activities and feedback. While a 'one size fits all' approach to teaching and learning is the easier option, it is not the approach taken by our staff. Quality differentiated activities, Individual Education Plans and a myriad of social and emotional engagement strategies, all are implemented to support the needs of the child.

As a parent or carer, we encourage you all to volunteer to assist our teachers during the hours of instruction. As part of a further layer of child safety, working with children checks are a legislated requirement for any extended period of child-related volunteer work. If you are volunteering for a one-off short lesson, a WWC is not necessary. However, you must sign a Volunteer Declaration Form detailing you are eligible for exemption due to being a parent or carer. These forms will be handed to you in the Office.




